Can I Sign Off On Rank Advancement?

- Parent(s)/guardian(s) and Scout siblings are not allowed to sign off on their related scout's rank advancement requirements.
- Star through Eagle requirements can only be signed-off by adult leaders.
- It is the Scout's responsibility to inform the Advancement Coordinator or Scribe of rank advancement that has been completed and signed-off on.
- Earned advancement in the Official Scouts BSA Handbook for Boys can be signed-off only by the following: the <u>Senior Patrol Leader</u>, <u>Assistant Senior</u> <u>Patrol Leader</u>, <u>Troop Guide</u>, <u>Patrol Leaders</u>, merit badge counselors (merit badge only - not handbook requirements), or camp staff assigned to that (merit badge counselor) role.
- Scout signing off needs to be First Class 90 days, working on rank advancement themselves, and be active in the Troop.

In addition to the Scoutmaster, the following fully trained and Scoutmaster approved adult leaders may sign off on rank handbook advancement items:

- Troop Committee Chair
- Assistant Scoutmasters
- Advancement Coordinator
- Outdoor/Activities Coordinator
- Unit & District Commissioners

The following Scouts may sign off on rank advancement:

- Senior Patrol Leader/Assistant Senior Patrol Leader/Troop Guide
 - Scout through 1st Class regardless of patrol
 - Must be 1st Class and active for 90+ days
- Patrol Leader
 - Scout though 1st Class for scouts in their patrol
 - Must be 1st Class and active for 90+ days
